Natural Crawling Insect Control

Customers interested in a natural product to effectively control crawling insects in your home or garden, we have a product for you! *Natural Guard Diatomaceous* (*die-uh-tuh-may-shuss*) *Earth* is a safe and effective organic insecticide that is not harmful to humans, animals or earthworms but does a great job killing cockroaches, ants (including fire ants), earwigs, millipedes, centipedes, silverfish, fleas, bed bugs, grass hoppers, slugs and many other crawling insects.



Diatomaceous Earth is a contact insecticide derived from a naturally occurring soft siliceous sedimentary rock that is crumbled into a fine powder. Because it is a light dust, it easily clings to the bodies of insects as they crawl over it. The powder is abrasive and cuts into the exoskeleton of insects, resulting in loss of body fluids, then dehydration. It remains effective as long as it is kept dry and undisturbed.

5 Tips for a Butterfly-Friendly Garden

Make your yard butterfly-friendly to bring color and movement to the landscape while aiding the pollination of flowers, fruit, and vegetable plants.

Unfortunately, urbanization and other development are shrinking butterflies' natural habitat, leaving fewer places to feed, mate, and lay eggs. Here are some tips to reverse that trend.

- Butterfly gardens don't have to be large. You can grow plants in containers on a patio or even in hanging pots and window boxes.
- Butterflies need the sun to maintain body temperature, so place your garden in the sunniest location possible.
- The key to attracting butterflies is to provide them with lots of nectar sources; they also prefer to feed on open, tube-shape flowers.
- All butterflies start out as caterpillars that require host plants on which to feed. Many of these are native plants—weeds
 and wildflowers that may already be growing on or near your property. Some good choices include clovers, milkweeds,
 and violets.
- After a rain, you may see butterflies congregating around a puddle or damp area in the garden to drink and extract minerals from the soil. Maintaining a puddle in the same spot will keep butterflies coming back.
